

This Gloria is an example of cueca music, a partner dance popular in regions of South America. According to IWS visiting professor C. Michael Hawn, Sosa wrote "Gloria, Gloria, Gloria" as people were disappearing from Chile, apparently being kidnapped or murdered. Hawn writes, "As a form of protest, Chilean women whose husbands or sons had disappeared would gather in a public plaza and dance this seemingly joyful dance alone, with their missing partner only in their imagination."






The Breaking of the Bread

The Communion of the People


The ministers receive the Sacrament in both kinds, and then immediately deliver it to the people.

Gluten-free wafers are available upon request.


