



FOOTSTEPS OF PAUL IN GREECE JULY 1-13, 2024 WITH IWS

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Greece is an enchanting destination whose rich and ancient history is important to all civilization. From the volcanic islands to the mountainous Peloponnese to the fertile plains in the north, the terrain is both rugged and inviting. For the Christian, Greece is rich. Paul first proclaimed the Gospel to Europe in Philippi, gave his most famous sermon in Athens in sight of the Parthenon, and had a close relationship with the church in Corinth. In Greece, the Orthodox Christians remained faithful and strong in spite of the years of Ottoman occupation. The majestic Cathedrals, the multiple monasteries, and the biblical sites all offer the traveler a deep and unparalleled spiritual experience. Greece never disappoints and all who visit once long to visit again.

MONDAY, JULY 01

Arrive in Thessaloniki

Upon arrival in **Thessaloniki**, transfer to hotel for check-in and overnight.

Note: depending on time of arrival, walk to the Aegean sea and the center of Thessaloniki for dinner.



TUESDAY, JULY 02

Thessaloniki–Lydia–Philippi–Kavala–Thessaloniki (Acts 16)

After breakfast, depart for **Lydia**, a church and holy baptismal site by the river that commemorates Lydia, Paul's first European convert. Continue to the famous archeological site of the city of **Philippi**, where Paul and Silas sang in jail. Visit the impressive theater, ancient basilica, prison, and agora; walk along the *Via Egnatia*. After lunch in **Kavala** (ancient **Neapolis** where Paul first set foot in Europe), walk through the old town, admiring the beauty of the architecture and gaze out to sea toward Samothrace from where Paul came. In the afternoon, drive back to Thessaloniki. Dinner and overnight Thessaloniki. **B, L, D**

WEDNESDAY, JULY 03

Thessaloniki–Berea–Kalabaka

Today we continue our visit to Thessaloniki. Our first stop is **St. Demetrios Church**, dedicated to the patron saint of Thessaloniki who was martyred for his Christian faith in the early fourth century. After visiting the amazing preserved catacombs

under the church, we take a short walk to the overlook of the agora of **ancient Thessaloniki** where Paul preached, rioters fruitlessly sought Paul and Silas, and Jason and the other believers sent them away under cover of night (Acts 17). Visit the **White Tower, Rotunda, and Arch of Galerius** before departing for **Veria** (ancient **Berea**), where the nobler Christians lived. Visit the holy mosaics at Berea and continue to **Kalabaka**. As we approach the town, the terrain changes drastically to reveal the high cliffs and caves where the medieval monastics retreated to worship and pray for the region. Dinner and overnight Kalambaka. **B, L, D**

THURSDAY, JULY 04

Kalabaka– Meteora--Itea

After breakfast, ascend to the mountain heights to visit **Meteora** monasteries, perched atop conical cliffs. The original monks were lifted in baskets, but we use stairs. Visit the highly decorated churches and grounds, imagining the monastic's life dedicated to prayer and austerity. After taking in the views, proceed to Itea, a small town on the Corinthian Gulf. Dinner and overnight Itea. **B, L, D**



FRIDAY, JULY 05

Itea–Delphi–Nafplio

Depart Itea and ascend again to the heights, this time to the fantastic archeological site of **Delphi**, the center of the ancient world and the site of the Delphic Oracle. Walk through the ancient temples, learn mythological origins, see the hippodrome, and visit the museum. After lunch overlooking the

majestic view, travel to **Nafplio** to visit the **Palimidi Fortress**, the 17th century Venetian castle built for defense. It stands majestically on a commanding hill above the Argolic Gulf. Descending the one thousand steps to town is optional, and we will enjoy a delicious dinner close to the town square. **B, L, D**



SATURDAY, JULY 06 Nafplio–Corinth–Kechries–Athens (Acts 18)

After breakfast, depart Nafplio to visit the ancient site of **Corinth**, where Paul visited multiple times, initially spending a year and a half there. Stand in the church built on the **Bema**, where Paul was judged by Gallio and found innocent. See the **Erastus Inscription** and then ascend to the **Acrocorinth**, the fortified castle above the city. Travel to the port city of Corinth, **Kechries** (ancient **Cenchrae**) where Phoebe led the church that met in her house (Romans 16) and gaze out toward Ephesus, the direction of Paul's journey after he left Corinth. Stand on the **Diolkos**, the ancient "road" that took boats across the narrow isthmus to avoid

the harsh winds around Achaia. Then view the recently built **Corinth Canal** that now spans the narrow land. Arrive in **Athens** and catch the first glimpse of the **Parthenon**. Dinner, overnight Athens. **B, L, D**

SUNDAY, JULY 07 Athens (Acts 17)

Begin the tour of the amazing historical city of Athens by visiting the **Acropolis Museum**, where there are images of all the ancient gods. Then ascend to the majestic **Acropolis** to the **Erechtheion** and the massive temple to the goddess Athena, the **Parthenon**. Visit the ancient **Agora** and picture Paul debating there. Finally, arrive on **Mars Hill**, the **Aereopagus**, where Paul's most famous speech proclaimed Christ to the city that worshiped all gods. Dinner in **Plaka** with traditional dancing, overnight Athens. **B, D**

MONDAY, JULY 08 Athens

After breakfast, head through the **National Garden** to Syntagma to watch the famous **Changing of the Guard** in front of the **Presidential Palace**. Optional hike up **Lykavitos Hill** for a breathtaking view of the Parthenon and surrounding city. Visit **Monastiraki**, the **Cathedral**, and the **Philopappos Monument**. **Free afternoon**. Dinner, overnight Athens. **B, D**

TUESDAY, JULY 09 Athens–Crete

Fly to our first island destination, Crete. Enjoy the drive along the northern coast of the island, from Heraklion to Rethimno. Visit the **Old Town of Rethimno**, the historical **Venetian Harbor** and the huge **Venetian Fortress** on the water. Return to Heraklion to visit the **Koules Fortress** and the modern **Church of St. Titus**. Then enjoy a stroll along the **Waterfront** and through **Old Town**. Dinner, overnight Heraklion. **B, L, D**



WEDNESDAY, JULY 10 Crete (Acts 27, Titus 1)

After breakfast continue to explore the largest of Greece's 4,000 islands. Head to **Kali Limenes** (ancient **Fair Havens**), the port where the ship that was taking Paul to Rome after he appealed to Caesar landed with difficulty. Move on to **Loutro Harbor** (ancient **Phoenix**) where the ship's owner and the centurion in charge of the prisoners had intended to winter. Visit the massive sixth-century **Basilica of Gortys** dedicated to the first bishop of Crete, St. Titus, the leader Paul left in Crete to care for the Christians. On the way back to Heraklion, visit the ancient Minoan city and **Palace of Knossos**. Dinner, overnight Heraklion. **B, L, D**

THURSDAY, JULY 11 Crete–Santorini

Fast ferry to Santorini, the most famous of Greece's islands. Tour **Fira** and walk along the **Caldera** enjoying the magnificent views of the colorful cliffs and sea. Free afternoon to explore towns and beaches. Overnight Santorini. **B, L**

FRIDAY, JULY 12 Santorini

Optional Caldera Hike to **Oia**, tour **Oia**, enjoy the picturesque beaches. Sunset dinner, overnight Santorini. **B, D**

SATURDAY, JULY 13 Santorini–Athens

Free time Santorini, Depart Santorini, fly to Athens.
